#### The Masters Series Concerts (2011-12)

The Masters Series Concerts (2011-12) comprise a series of approximately 50 mostly Sunday afternoon programs at Studio Hollywood (www.studio-hollywood.com), spanning the cycles of piano music of most of the great composers for the instrument, from Bach and the Classical and Romantic masters, to great composers of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. The programs are intended to provide guests with 1-2 hours of quality weekly listening in a contemplative setting, surround-ded by the natural beauty that is visible from the recital hall. The performances are intended to be informal but well-prepared offerings, as an interim step toward full concert preparation.

# Enrique Granados: GOYESCAS

Enrique Granados y Campiña (27 July 1867 – 24 March 1916) was a Catalan pianist and also a talented painter in the style of Francisco Goya. He was born in Lérida. As a young man he studied piano in Barcelona and in 1887 he went to Paris to study. He was unable to become a student at the Paris Conservatoire but was able to take private lessons with a conservatoire professor, Bériot, whose mother was a famed soprano of Spanish ancestry. Bériot insisted on extreme refinement in tone production, which strongly influenced Granados' own teaching of pedal technique. He also fostered Granados' abilities in improvisation. Just as important were his studies with Felipe Pedrell, with whom Isaac Albeniz also studied. He returned to Barcelona in 1889. His first successes were at the end of the 1890s, with zarzuela Maria del Carmen, which earned the attention of King Alfonso XIII.

In 1911 Granados premiered his suite for piano *Goyescas*, which became his most famous work, and earned him the Legion d'honneur from the French government, much as Isaac Albeniz would earn the same award just a few years earlier for his Iberia suite. It is a set of six pieces based on paintings of Fernando Goya. Such was the success of this work that he was encouraged to expand it; he wrote an opera based on the subject in 1914, but the outbreak of World War I forced the European premiere to be canceled. It was performed for the first time in New York City on 28 January 1916, and was very well received. Shortly afterwards, he was invited to perform a piano recital for President Woodrow Wilson. Prior to leaving New York, Granados also made live-recorded player piano music rolls for the New-York-based Aeolian Company's "Duo-Art" system, all of which survive today, his very

last recordings. The delay incurred by accepting the recital invitation caused him to miss his boat back to Spain. Instead, he took a ship to England, where he boarded the passenger ferry Sussex for France. On the way across the English Channel, the Sussex was torpedoed by a German U-boat. In a failed attempt to save his wife Amparo, whom he saw flailing about in the water some distance away, Granados jumped out of his lifeboat and drowned. Ironically, he had a morbid fear of water for his entire life, and he was returning from his first-ever series of ocean voyages. Ironically too, the ship broke in two parts and only one sank (along with 80 passengers); the other part of the ship where his cabin was did not sink and was towed to port, with most of the passengers on board.

Govescas consists of six selections, subtitled "Los majos enamorados" (Gallants in love). The first piece, *Los Requiebros* (flattery), signifies a charming form of gallant conduct in which the lover praises the grace and beauty of his beloved in a whisper, the aim being not conquest bu rather affirmation of mutual love. Cologuio en la Reja (Conversation at the window) is again of an intimately amorous nature, while the evocative *El Fandango* de Candil (Fandango by Candlelight) epitomizes the grace and high spirits of this dance. A folk melody, intelligently re-worked, is the foundation of the very beautiful Quejas, o La Maja y el Ruíseñor (Laments, or the Beauty and the Nightingale), for which Granados has woven a harmonic robe of indefinable subtlety and vibrant color. Dedicated to his wife Amparo, the profoundly introspective quality of this section makes it the outstanding piece in the collection, and also one of the most important piano works of the century. El Amor y La Muerte (Love and Death), is the most improvisatory of the set, and is pervaded by a feeling of intense sorrow and musically harking back to the earlier pieces. Reminiscence is present, too, in the final *Epilogo, o Serenata del Espectro* (Epilogue, or the Phantom's Serenade), in which an elaborated guotation from the Dies Irae is embedded. Pelele (The Straw Man), subtitled Escena Goyesca (Goyesque Scene), is usually programmed as an encore to the *Goyescas* suite.

Alan Murray has appeared as a concerto soloist with orchestras in Westchester and in solo and chamber music recitals. He holds a degree in physics and languages from Cornell, where he also received a special University award for distinguished piano soloist. The Masters Series Concerts represent a continuation of the Sunrise Music Series programs, incepted in the Sept 2010–June2011 season. In addition to this year's Masters Series, Alan continues the Sunrise Series programs Sundays at 8:30am, with the 2011-12 series devoted to the cycle of keyboard music of J.S. Bach, which also appears in this year's Masters Series in April. The 2010-11 Sunrise Series was the subject of a Nov/2010 feature article in The Rivertown's Enterprise. His future plans include performances of the Masters Series at universities and other cultural centers here and abroad in the coming years. A specialist in the Financial Institutions capital markets group at Moody's, where he focuses on U.S., major Latin American and worldwide developing markets, Alan also provides music at the early Sunday morning services of the First Unitarian Society of Westchester, where he enjoys blending classical music with diverse world musical traditions. Alan resides in Hastings with his wife Amada and daughter Celia, where they also own and operate Galápagos Books, focused on world languages, children's and general-interest books, local authors, and educational materials.
